Reconfirm how instruction (Return to Learn Plan) is going to be delivered during the 20/21 school year:

As per the original Extended Learning Plan approved on September 14th, 2020 and in consideration of current county key health metrics as provided by the Ionia County Health Department, the plan for instructional delivery for ISD administered programs are as follows:

Haynor School will offer in-person instruction for grades K-5 with a remote instruction option for students. In-person instruction will be held Monday through Friday; with instruction being delivered remotely on the second Friday of the month. Virtual instruction will be offered only to families that make a request.

October Data---Ionia County Health Department

- 1) Trend of COVID-19 cases/positive COVID-19 tests: **Both increasing over the past week (September 22nd to September 29th). Cases per million have increased from 28.9 to 44.5. Percent positive has increased from 1.6 to 2.2.**
- 2) Hospitalizations due to COVID-19: **One at SIH in the past week.**
- 3) Number of deaths resulting from COVID-19 in the past 14 days: **Zero**
- 4) COVID-19 cases for each day for every one million individuals: **See trend above – you can get the daily numbers at <https://www.mistartmap.info/>**
- 5) Percentage of positive COVID-19 tests over a four-week period: **increased from 1.5 to 2.2% from September 1st to September 29th**
- 6) Health Care capacity strength: **Nobody knows what this means because the legislature decided not to define it. There is a group from the State and LHDs working on a reasonable definition.**
- 7) Testing, tracing, and containment infrastructure with regard to COVID-19: **The Health Department and Sparrow are holding steady with regard to testing and tracing. Containment infrastructure is weak. We have no way to know if most people are truly complying with quarantine and isolation. This is a problem across the State.**

We remain in a pattern of peaks and valleys – this week was a peak. We saw a new record for the number of cases and have multiple outbreaks that we are tracking. Our numbers remain low overall, but we are watching closely. I am waiting to see if they dip again or continue to climb. At this point I would *not* recommend a switch to virtual only, but please be aware that could change at any time. Keep your plans up to date.
